There are 18 school busses that safely bring our students to and from all the neighbouring communities and farms into Sacred Heart Wingham everyday, so it is truly a community school and a hub for Catholic Families and Families seeking a Faith-filled and academically rich learning environment.

What is unique about this school?

Sacred Heart Wingham is unique in its large and newly built playgrounds. In the summer of 2019, a new playground was opened to the West and North of Sacred Heart featuring a large road hockey pad, a basketball court, a new larger playground for students from grade 3 to 8, and planned for the spring or summer of 2020 are two new gaga-ball pits. This is in addition to the soccer fields, baseball diamond, sun shelter, and many areas of nature surrounding the school. The school also features a Best Start program offering before and after school care through the North Huron municipality. The Best Start program "is open from 6:30 am until 9 am and again from 3 pm until 6:00 pm. These programs are licenced for children in JK/SK and up to age 12. Spaces are filled on a first come, first served basis".
